

## **\*MAHASKA COUNTY 2026 DUST CONTROL INFORMATION AND POLICY\***

Applications and permits received by the supplier by April 10<sup>th</sup> will be available for treatment on or after May 15<sup>th</sup>. If you miss the April 10<sup>th</sup> deadline, you WILL NOT be able to get your area treated until on or after June 5<sup>th</sup>. Second applications will be applied on or after July 24, 2026.

### **NOTICE: PAY Permit FEES TO THE DUST CONTROL SUPPLIER**

#### **\*If you are using H&D Services...**

The product used is Lignin Sulfonate (tree sap) & Liquid Chloride combination. The office number is 641-623-2330 or cell number 641-990-2161. Please contact them at the number above regarding ALL forms and fees, including Mahaska County's permit fee. Once all amounts are paid to H&D, notification will be sent to Mahaska County Engineer. The County will prepare the road as needed before the supplier applies the product.

**\*If you are using Binns & Stevens Inc...** The product is Calcium Chloride. The office number is 641-672-2566.

Please refer to their website or contact them at the number above regarding ALL forms and fees, including Mahaska County's permit fee. Once all amounts are paid to Binns & Stevens, notification will be sent to Mahaska County Engineer. The County will prepare the road as needed before the supplier applies the product.

Contractor flags and dust control signs are available at either the Mahaska County Engineer office located at 2074 Old Highway 163, Oskaloosa, OR from the contractor.

### **MAHASKA COUNTY GUIDELINES**

1. Petroleum products and used oil are not allowed.
2. The width of the application must be at least 20 feet wide.
3. To prevent blading or rocking over the dust control product: applicant is responsible for placing and maintaining flags and "DUST CONTROL" signs at each end of the treated surface. Flags and signs must be visible and maintained for the entire season. The County is not responsible for broken, damaged, or missing signs.
4. The permit is valid until October 1, 2026. After that date, Mahaska County may blade or rock the road as needed for winter preparation.
5. Mahaska County has no obligation and will assume no responsibility for the dust control product or application. Complaints regarding the performance of the dust control product should be directed at the applicator.
6. The County reserves the right to maintain the road at any time and is not responsible for lost dust control.
