Discussion was about perpetual care already being paid by families. Perpetual care was established at Forest Cemetery in 1925. There were 361 veterans buried there before perpetual care was started. Marvin Anderson also visited with the board about keeping the veterans graves up.

The engineer discussed with the board about South F Street and 263<sup>rd</sup> St. The property owner is interested in sealcoating a portion of this area. The property owner would be paying for this and the county would have to do the maintenance. No decision was made at this time.
