#### August 18, 2023

The Mahaska County Board of Supervisors met in regular session on the above date at 9:00 a.m. in the third-floor conference room of the Mahaska County courthouse. Present were the following board members: Chairman – Mark Groenendyk; Vice Chairman – Steve Wanders; and Member – Chuck Webb. Also present were Darin Hite, IT; Tom Flaherty, Economic Development; Eric Dursky, County Sanitarian; Andrew McGuire, County Engineer; Shawn Christ, Oskaloosa Development Services Director; Channing Rucks, Oskaloosa Herald; Mike Fisher, OCSD Superintendent; Mark Scholes, OCSD Middle School Principal; Karter Flaherty, Sarah Phillips, Evie Adam, Micah Van Mersbergen and Teri Rogers, County Auditor.

Chairman Groenendyk opened the meeting with the pledge of allegiance.

It was moved by Wanders seconded by Webb to approve the agenda for today's meeting.

The board tabled approval of the minutes of August 7. Corrections are needed.

It was moved by Webb seconded by Wanders to open the public hearing regarding Ordinance #54. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Vice-chair Steve Wanders explained the purpose of the Ordinance since members of the Oskaloosa Community School District were in attendance.

Micah Van Mersbergen updated the Board on what has transpired in other counties in Iowa over the past couple of months. Many counties are adjusting their ordinances requiring farther setbacks, max height for new wind turbines or max number of wind turbines that will be allowed to be installed.

It was moved by Wanders seconded by Webb to close the public hearing regarding Ordinance #54. One additional public hearing will be held on Tuesday, September 5<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. All present voted aye. Motion carried.

Mark Scholes, OCSD Middle School Principal, along with three members of the Student Council appeared before the Board. The students laid out the five beliefs of the school district which included information about their vision for the culture, values, purpose and mission. The Board thanked the students for their presentation and involvement.

Shawn Christ, Oskaloosa Development Services Director gave a presentation to the Board for the PLAN OSKY Zoning Ordinance. One main feature of the plan is to provide jurisdiction for the 2-mile area around Oskaloosa (excluding the cities of Beacon and University Park) to ensure development integrates with future growth plans. Approval steps for the plan include three City Council readings. The first reading was August 7th. The next reading is scheduled for August 21st and the final reading for Sept. 5th.

The Board tabled approving the MOU (Memorandum of Understanding) regarding reimbursement from the mental health agency of SE Iowa for County Employees until the next meeting.

It was moved by Wanders seconded by Webb to approve the following resolution approving capital improvement plan, assign funds and approve transfers for FY23/24. All present voted aye. Motion carried.
